


The Salvation Army is a part of the worldwide evangelical Christian Church and human service provider.

Sunday is coming!

The first 'Easter' weekend covered the full range of emotions, including tragedy and heartbreak. As we honour this event every year it is important not to jump right to the end of the story. The three days build on each other to prove that love wins in the end.

Easter Sunday is a response to 'Good' Friday. It is a response to the hurt and the loss and the pain and the grief and the death of the 'Good' Fridays of life. All of Jesus' teachings foreshadow this moment. He points to the violence and hate and aggression that will happen to himself, and those who believe in Him, and it may seem all too much to overcome.

Easter Sunday is also a response to the 'Easter Saturdays' of life: the silence, the not knowing what is to come next, the days of grief and despair. Sitting in the middle of the chaos and heartbreak grasping at promises which can seem so distant.

But, Easter reminds us that, as Tony Campolo once preached, 'Sunday is coming.' This story has hope, that even in the most difficult times in our life, the hurt, then loss, the pain, the grief... Easter reminds us that there is always hope. Because love wins in the end. Even in the silence, love was waiting for us, reaching out to us, ready to roll away the stones which can trap each of us.

In the darkness of life's Fridays, in the silences of life's Saturdays, try to hold on to the message of Easter - hope is never lost. When we feel stuck in the horror or the silence, we can hold on to love. A love that shines in its fullness on Easter. A love that overcomes not just hurt and loss and pain and grief – but overcomes death itself and promises us that not only do we not have to

be alone in the midst of them but that there is new life at the end of them. Sunday is coming!

Easter Week

Try this scripture journey through the week leading to Easter for a fresh new take. Start on Palm Sunday April 9th.

Palm Sunday Read Luke 19:28-42 and Zechariah 9:9. Reflection: How often do you praise God for coming into your life?

Monday Read about Jesus at the Temple in Luke 19:45-20:8.. Reflection: Think about your body as the temple. What does Jesus need to clean to be truly honored?

Tuesday Read about Jesus teaching at the Temple in Luke 20:1-40. Reflection: Have there been times when Jesus' truth has seemed harsh to you or hard to follow. Did you grumble and back away? Did you question Him?

Wednesday Read who Jesus said He was and the reactions in Luke 20:41-47 & Luke 22:1-6. Refection: It is sometimes hard to be a disciple of the truth and the way. Sometimes we want Jesus to do what we want or act the way we feel He should. Think on this and how that led Judas astray.

Thursday Read Luke 22:7-46. Passover and the washing of the feet. Reflection: Jesus told us when we break bread (eat a meal) to remember Him. Do you say "grace" before you eat? Think of the disciples. His disciples couldn't keep awake even one hour to pray with Him. Tonight see if you can spend one hour praying with Jesus. Scripture tells us He prays for us unceasingly.

Good Friday Read Luke 22:47-23:48 and John 19:1-37. Reflection: Go oto a service or watch a movie about the life and death of Jesus, keeping in mind He did this all for you. He loves you that much. Or listen to and reflect upon hymns and songs about the crucifixion.

Saturday Read Luke 23:50-56 and John 19:38-42. Reflection: As you prepare for Easter, think of what Jesus is doing for your sake even though you can't see Him.

Sunday – Easter! Awaken with a song in your heart. He is Risen — The Lord Is Risen Indeed! Read Luke 24 and John 20. Reflection: go to church. Be with family. In your own words, relay to others what you have just experienced through the past week and what it has meant to you.



In the week leading up to Easter at 12.30pm this church will host a reflection on the stations of the cross. Bring your lunch, your bible, and spend some time reflecting on Jesus' journey of sacrifice. All welcome.



Every morning at 6.30am this church will be open for prayer. Pop in on your way to work and spend some quality time prepraing yourself for Easter. (Coffee and tea is available if you need some assistance...)




AB Youth



A Forgiveness Project

Currently our Sunday kids ministries are together in one group. They are all learning about forgiveness this month, as we lead into Easter.

Forgiveness is a reflection of the character of God.

Throughout Scripture, we are reminded about God's grace and forgiveness.


God makes us white as snow. (Isaiah 1:18)

God's mercies are new every morning. (Lams 3:22-23)

God is faithful and just to forgive our sins. (1 John 1:9)

When our relationship with God was broken beyond repair, God offered His only Son as the way to forgive


us and restore the broken relationship. Since we are created in God's image, we have the ability to offer forgiveness when people in our lives hurt us. God's love in us makes it possible for us to forgive others and work towards fixing our own relationships that break down from time to time.



God showed us just how much He cares about forgiveness when He made the ultimate sacrifice and sent Jesus to pay the price for our sin. While sin separates us from God, He offers grace and forgiveness as a gift for us to receive. We have been forgiven of so much, it's only right that we turn to those in our lives and offer forgiveness to them in return. That's why we think it's important for us to help our kids and families discover more about Forgiveness-deciding that someone who has wronged you doesn't have to pay.

The memory verse, from Paul's letter to the church at Colossi, reminds us not only that God forgave our sins, but also that we should forgive others instead of holding grudges against one another. We pray that throughout March, families will let go of what they're holding against each other and choose to forgive. We think that this could be a powerful month in the lives of kids and families in our churches.

We will spend the month of March taking a closer look at the way forgiveness shows up throughout a few of the parables Jesus told His followers.


